When homeless men need a place to go to rebuild their lives, Safe Harbor offers comprehensive services to help them. Services include food, shelter, long- and short-term help and assistance for recovery from substance abuse.

Depending on the desire of the individual, long-term programs are available. Our long-term programs, *LifeSkills* and FOCUS, offer help to men who want to overcome their addictions and rejoin the community. By offering troubled men a step-by-step path to better lives, their potential for long-term success and spiritual growth increases.

Joy House Offers Safety to Women and Children

When homeless women with children arrive at our door, they are often seeking shelter from a storm that goes far beyond the discomfort of rain, wind and snow. Today, nearly 40% are fleeing from domestic violence. Often drug addiction, job loss, fire and basic poverty are driving forces.

When they arrive, they find a range of short- and long-term solutions in Joy House, including residency, training programs, child care and educational programs. Our goal is to help families become self-sufficient and stable.

CrossTrainers Academy Offers Inner City Kids the Chance to Succeed

Recognizing the need to provide a quality, Christian education for at-risk children in our community, the Milwaukee Rescue Mission opened CrossTrainers Academy in 2006. The school also serves some of the children who are staying in Joy House.

Through diligent work, students gain the skills necessary to be successful in their academic efforts. In addition to reading and mathematics, a full range of classes is offered, including science, social studies, Bible, physical education, music and art.

CrossTrainers Academy is part of the Milwaukee Parental Choice Program. Thus, it receives funding for each child whose family income falls below levels that have been determined by the state.

A History of Partnership

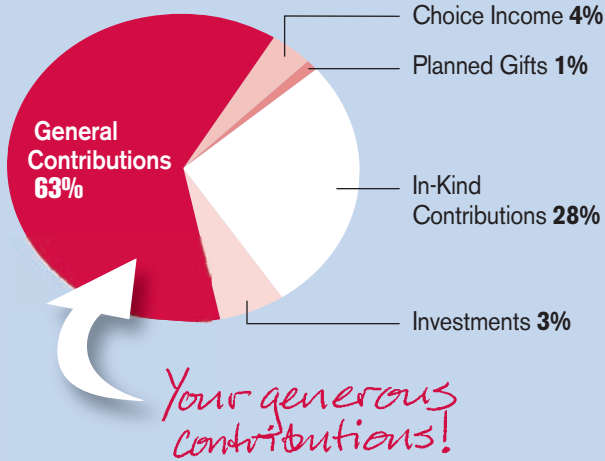

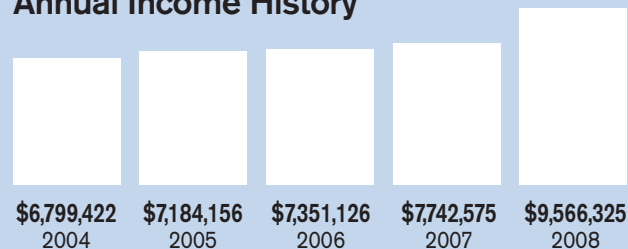

Annual Income History

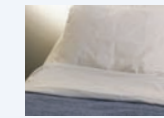


Where Does Your Dollar Go?

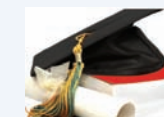

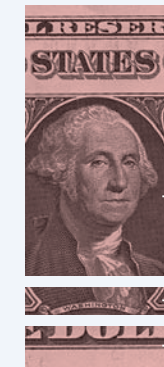
