

Dear Friend,

Sometimes I try to imagine what it must've been like for the shepherds on that holy night long ago. They were minding their own business (and their sheep) in the fields near Bethlehem, when they had a surprise visitor — "an angel of the Lord," Luke tells us.

"And the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear" (Luke 2:9, ESV). I would've been terrified too! But then the angel delivered the greatest message of all time: "I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord."

The angel told them to go into Bethlehem, where they would find the baby, lying in a manger. *A baby who is also a Savior?* Their heads must've been spinning.

As if that announcement weren't earth-shaking enough, suddenly a multitude — thousands, perhaps millions — of angels filled the sky and said, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!"

That's about when my imagination hits its limits. I cannot fathom what that must have been like for those shepherds that night. Fear and joy, all at once! Struggling neighbors who come to the Milwaukee Rescue Mission are familiar with those emotions. They've experienced fear through evictions, through domestic abuse, through street life, through hunger and heartache and hopelessness.

But when they come to MRM — all year round, but especially at Christmas — they find joy, even in the midst of their struggles. Because we are all about that "good news of great joy for *all* people." That's the gospel. That's the Christmas message.

FROM A DEATH WISH TO NEW LIFE

"Growing up in a family surrounded by drugs ... I thought it was normal. I was young, and didn't know right from wrong. It wasn't until later that I learned it's not a normal way of living."

If you met Jeff today, you'd never guess that his childhood was clouded by drug abuse.

His dad, who struggled with lung cancer and COPD, died of an accidental overdose just as Jeff was graduating from high school. Seven months later, his mom died of an opioid overdose. His older brother and sister were using at that point, too. "It made me feel alone, like the odds were stacked up against me."

Jeff started using in his late teens, both drugs and alcohol. After his sister overdosed and died, his own addiction spiraled out of control.

"I was on a death wish," he says. "After losing my parents and my sister, I figured there was nothing left."

But then he met a woman who would eventually become his wife — who loved him unconditionally. That love motivated Jeff to change his life.

His wife was hopeful when Jeff first came through our doors for help — even if Jeff wasn't. "I was nasty and selfish when I got here," Jeff says. "I was angry and resentful. This wasn't part of my plan."

But after receiving basic needs at MRM — nutritional meals, safe shelter and fresh clothing — Jeff regained his strength and clarity. He joined our recovery program, benefitting from comprehensive

care like Christian counseling, mentorship, work therapy, adult education, addiction recovery support and more. Soon, he realized that God's plan is something much better.

"I began to see God here," explains Jeff, a graduate of our New Journey program. "God takes you by the hand, and allows you to feel loved and forgiven. I finally have a sense of hope."

Today, Jeff is sober, gainfully employed and grateful to friends like you for sticking with him, too.

"I want to say thank you to people who support MRM," he says. "You saved my life, and you will save other people's lives who come here. You help get us out of our mess, give us the opportunity to know the Lord."



TAX-WISE TIPS FOR OUR PARTNERS

Your partnership with MRM means so much! We thought you'd be interested in some tax-wise tips for stretching your dollars through your support. Consider:

Appreciated Stock: If you've owned stock for at least a year, you can receive a double tax benefit by donating it to MRM. You'll receive a tax deduction for the fair market value of the stock, and you'll avoid capital gains tax.

Real Estate: If you have real estate that's increased in value that you no longer need, consider gifting it prior to a sale. By doing so, you can bypass the capital gain and receive a charitable deduction.

(RA) If you're 70½ or older, you can make tax-free distributions from your IRA, up to \$105,000 per year. These gifts count toward your annual required minimum distribution (RMD), and none of these distributions will be included in your adjusted gross income.

OUT OF THE WILDERNESS

Ajaya was in a toxic relationship — and one damaging to her son, Prince. Eventually, she decided enough was enough. Ajaya fled with Prince, but soon discovered the challenge of trying to make it on her own with a 2-year-old. "It was a ripple effect," she explains. "I had to quit my job because I couldn't find childcare. Then, I couldn't renew my lease."



They stayed with extended family for a while, but when that grew old, they had no place to go. She felt God leading them to MRM, but was resistant at first. "I was ashamed, hurt and confused," she says.

But when Ajaya and Prince arrived at our family shelter, Joy House, they were met with open arms — and nourishing meals, warm shelter and clean clothing — and staff helped her work through those initial feelings. She felt the shame, hurt and confusion melt away ... and give way to love.

"They showed me so much grace," she remembers. She was grateful for safe shelter and meals for herself and her son. Through counseling, Ajaya began addressing past trauma — and hopes to turn her experience into encouragement for others. "What I've been through, and what I've experienced since being here ... I think it'll help people.

"Without MRM, we'd probably be on the streets. But I always trusted God to provide a way, and the people here have been very gracious to me."

Today, Ajaya is looking forward to the future — and, for the first time in a long time, to Christmas.

"Thinking back, the holidays weren't very enjoyable. But this year, I'm excited because I have Prince, and we get to have a different kind of Christmas together. We get to create our own celebration!"
