## LAZARUS AND Our Mysion

Dear Friend,

When thinking about Bible passages at Easter time, many typically turn to the resurrection of Jesus. But this Easter, I'm also thinking about another resurrection — when Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead, as told in John 11.

Lazarus had already been dead for days when Jesus arrived in Bethany. I love the conversation between Jesus and Martha that takes place before the miracle. Jesus assures her, "Your brother will rise again." Martha thinks Jesus means "in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus could have responded, "No, Martha, I mean today," but said something else entirely:

"I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?"

Yes, Martha did believe. And you may know the rest of the story: Jesus shouts, "Lazarus, come out." Wonder of wonders, he does — back from the dead!

Lazarus could be a metaphor for just about anyone who walks through our doors seeking help. On the surface, many of them may seem too deep in their addiction, trauma, illness or hardship to turn things around. But when they come through our doors and learn about Jesus' love for them, they find hope. Basic needs are met, hearts are comforted and struggling people find new life and fresh starts. They're like living resurrection stories in themselves.

Our Easter theme centers on three words: *Restore. Renew. Rejoice*. Christ's resurrection makes it all possible. And your support provides the means for those transformed lives.

That's our calling, to point every "Lazarus" we meet to the One who restores and renews.

### Because Of Your Kindness, TIMOTHY OVERCAME HIS ANGER AND FOUND PEACE

Some days, Timothy looks back at his old self and shakes his head in disbelief.

"I was angry all the time," he says. "I even yelled at homeless people. 'What's wrong with you? Get a job!"

Timothy's anger didn't develop overnight.
Raised in a military family, he spent his early years constantly moving — and the instability took its toll. "I hated that life," Timothy remembers. "My dad was a Navy SEAL, so we lived all over — the Philippines, Okinawa, San Diego. Dad was always gone, so it was just me, my mom and my brother. We were so isolated." Timothy begged to live with his grandparents in Chicago, which his parents eventually allowed.

"My grandparents were great," Timothy says.
"But they were old and didn't have rules." The lack of structure was disastrous. "I didn't know anything about drugs or alcohol before. But in Chicago, I had my first beer at 12. Soon after, I started smoking pot daily."

The anger and rebellion that began in those years shaped the next four decades — and Timothy's addiction to marijuana spiraled. By the time he was an adult, he needed it just to function. "I worked as a sous chef, but I'd sneak off the job to smoke. Eventually, my boss said, 'You're a great worker, but we can't tolerate this anymore.' They let me go."

Timothy lost his apartment, and it wasn't long after that he wore out his welcome sleeping on friends' couches. Homeless, desperate and hopeless, Timothy lugged his suitcase to a bus stop. Suddenly, he noticed a woman beside him, who asked if he was okay.

Timothy opened up about his situation. The woman listened intently, then mentioned MRM. "They'll help you," she said. He looked down at his phone to search for directions, and when he looked up to thank her, she was gone. Timothy doesn't know who she was, but believes God crossed their paths for a reason.

That day, Timothy walked through our doors, thinking he'd hit rock bottom. But conversations with our team buoyed his spirit. One said, "You know God loves you, right? And he has a plan for you." In time, Timothy started to believe it. He joined our recovery program, gave his life to the Lord and has been sober now for almost a year — his longest stretch since childhood. Today, he works in our kitchen, using his culinary talents to serve others.

"I asked God to forgive me for the way I treated people before," he says. "Now I say to them, 'You know God loves you, right? He has a plan for you.'

Timothy's transformation is indeed due to the Lord, but it couldn't have happened without supporters like you. To you, Timothy says thank you!





FROM HOMELESSNESS TO a Life Together

Your kindness gave each of them a fresh start. But that was only the beginning.

Nobody goes to a homeless shelter to find a life partner. But for LeRoy and Shameca, that's exactly how things turned out — even though they didn't start that way.

Shameca had a difficult childhood. "It left me with a lot of scars on my heart," she remembers. To cope, she turned to alcohol. Tough situations left her homeless on several occasions, and she ended up coming to MRM three different times for help.

The first two times, Shameca says she wasn't ready to do the hard work of making changes. But the third time, she was ready. "I surrendered my life to God, and opened myself up for Him to do what He had to do in my heart. I stayed focused on those things."

LeRoy, meanwhile, had come to Milwaukee from Indianapolis in 2020 to rekindle a relationship with his father, who had been mostly absent during LeRoy's childhood. His dad initially welcomed his son into his home, but things soured after a while. Heartbroken, LeRoy turned to drugs and alcohol to numb his pain — and when his dad moved away, LeRoy had nowhere to go. Facing homelessness and addiction, he came to MRM and joined our recovery program.

Once both LeRoy and Shameca turned their lives around — independently, before their relationship began — they joined our staff. And that's when the sparks began to kindle.



LeRoy was a cook in the kitchen, and Shameca was a preschool teacher. He served her meals, smiling, and she smiled back. They made small talk. And then their conversations went deeper — about life things, spiritual things, eternal things.

LeRoy ended up attending Shameca's church, and they rode to Bible study together. "I saw what a godly woman she was," he says, "and I started falling in love with her."

Shameca feels the same: "When I saw that he had a heart for God, that he was thirsty for the Lord, I just knew. Like, 'Lord, yes, he's the one."
